### COMPETITIONS REPORT TO 19TH JULY

The Senior Mixed Open took place on Friday 16th July. The change of format to Am-Am stableford had been successful with the highest number of entries ever received for the competition. 124 players took part, the majority luckily missing the late afternoon rain. In one of the closest finishes in an open for some time the winners were Bob and Avis Griffin (Stoke Rochford) and Alan and Peggy Newton (Melton) with 73 points on count back from runners up Richard and Fay Hutton, Gay and Eddie Cham (Melton
